21 Days Covenant Renewal Fasting and Prayer Revival

The Lord God of All possibilities - DAY 7

Topic: What makes God the God of all possibilities.

Prayer: Oh God of all possibilities, let your hands of all possibilities rest on me to make the impossible possible in Jesus name.

2. O Lord by the power of all possibilities, allow you miracle, signs and wonders in my life today in Jesus name.

3. O God allow your miracles, signs and wonders in the GCBO that will glorify your name.

Text: Romans 4:17, “as it is written, “I have made you a father of many nations”) in the presence of Him whom he believed—God, who gives life to the dead and calls those things which do not exist as though they did;

God is a specialist in dealing with impossibilities. ‘Impossibility’ means something that cannot be done or occur.

Let us look at some things The Lord God of All Possibilities can do

1. He can make animal to do the work of man:

1 Sam.6: 7-12

God sent two wild cows to carry the Ark of the Lord back to Israel, leaving their calves behind.

He made Balam's donkey to speak like human

Numbers 22:27-30 And when the donkey saw the Angel of the Lord, she lay down under Balaam; so Balaam's anger was aroused, and he struck the donkey with his staff.

28 Then the Lord opened the mouth of the donkey, and she said to Balaam, “What have I done to you, that you have struck me these three times?” 29 And Balaam said to the donkey, “Because you have abused me. I wish there were a sword in my hand, for now I would kill you!”

30 So the donkey said to Balaam, “Am I not your donkey on which you have ridden, ever since I became yours, to this day? Was I ever disposed to do this to you?”

And he said, “No.”

Prayer: Oh God of all possibilities, use whoever and whatever you are to use for me to fulfill destiny in Jesus name.

2. He can change Physical Law: 2 Kings 6:4-7, God made an iron axe head to float like a cork. He can do the impossible!

Prayers: Oh Lord, change the law of nature to bring your plan and purpose for my life to reality.

My father and my God use what pleases you to restore all my lost blessings and glories in Jesus name.

3. Healing of long time sickness

John 5:7-9, The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me."

8 Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." 9 And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked.

The woman issue of blood was healed.

Matt. 9:20-22; And suddenly, a woman who had a flow of blood for twelve years came from behind and touched the hem of His garment. 21 For she said to herself, "If only I may touch His garment, I shall be made well." 22 But Jesus turned around, and when He saw her He said, "Be of good cheer, daughter; your faith has made you well." And the woman was made well from that hour.

Prayers:

4. When God says a thing, He watches over His word to fulfil it (Jeremiah 1:12).

If God says He will do something for you, He will do it! He always keeps His promises, but there are some things that you have to do in order to receive from Him. The best example of this is seen in the life of Abraham. When God promised Abraham that Sarah would give birth to a son, Abraham had to ignore his natural circumstances, have faith in God's promise, and believe that God was powerful enough to do what He said He would do.

Romans 4:19-21 tells of the steps Abraham followed to receive the IMPOSSIBLE promise God made to him. This passage of Scripture makes one thing clear: If you're going to receive from God, you have to have to do the same things Abraham did –

1. Consider not,
2. Stagger not,
3. Give glory to God,
4. And be fully persuaded.

1 Consider Not

He didn't take into account the natural circumstances that told him it was impossible for him and Sarah to have a child.

Abraham's faith was so strong that he didn't consider the fact that both he and Sarah were beyond the age of having children.

God promised him that they would have a son, and Abraham didn't even blink an eye! He did not allow the obstacles that were in front of him to stop him from believing God.

2 Stagger Not

Think about it; common sense tells us that a 99-year-old man and a 90-year-old woman will not be able to have children.

But Abraham didn't say anything against it at all.

In other words, he didn't waver. The Contemporary English Version says: "But Abraham never doubted or questioned God's promise." A person who staggers or wavers in faith will not receive anything from God. (James 1: 6-7).

Abraham acknowledged the fact that he was almost a hundred years old. He knew the condition of his body. But he refused to consider those things and chose instead to consider what God said.

3 Give Glory to God

Romans 4:20: "He did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strengthened in faith, GIVING GLORY TO GOD."

Abraham gave glory to God for the blessing before it ever happened. You have to believe God and thank Him for the answer, when you pray (Philippians 4:6-7, Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; 7 and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

Do not wait until you get the answer before you praise God for it!

4 Be Fully Persuaded

Abraham was strong in faith, so he didn't consider the circumstances or stagger at the promise of God. He wavered not concerning what he believed.

Why? Because he was fully persuaded. He was fully convinced that God is able to do whatever He promises.

You see, our position is to consider not, stagger not, give glory to God, and be fully persuaded—that's our responsibility
