The Lord God of All possibilities - DAY 2

TOPIC: The Impossibilities Jesus Made Possible

The dictionary defines impossible as “incapable of being done, attained, or fulfill.

Something that is impossible to achieve.

So, what’s impossible to achieve in your life?” Perhaps an adult and some things are difficult for you to achieve?

Maybe your marriage in which you hardly enjoy your spouse?

A physical ailment declared untreatable by a doctor? Whatever the categories of your “impossibilities” Jesus Christ of Nazareth is able to make it possible.

No counselor, friend, pastor, or family member can bring the needed change.

If I’ve described your situation, I have great news. We are all faced with a series situations as impossible situations but it will become possible tonight.

How do I know? Because Jesus has the power to make the impossible possible! How can I be certain? Because Jesus demonstrated such power during His ministry.

The book of John records some miracles that show Jesus’ astonishing power over situations that look impossible.

Let’s look at some briefly and the power they display

1. Power over quality.

In John 2:1–12 At a wedding in Cana, the celebrants were about to be put to shame, when the wine ran out, Jesus told the servants to fill six stone pots with water and take a cupful to the headwaiter. Putting the cup to his lips, the waiter tasted that Jesus had not only turned the water into wine, but the best wine.

Prayer: God of all possibilities, I am about to be put to shame, intervene and bring the your best out of me in the name of Jesus.

2. Power over distance.

John 4:49-52, The nobleman said to Him, "Sir, come down before my child dies!"

50 Jesus said to him, "Go your way; your son lives." So the man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him, and he went his way. 51 And as he was now going down, his servants met him and told him, saying, "Your son lives!"

52 Then he inquired of them the hour when he got better. And they said to him, "Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him."

Prayer: Oh Lord distance is never a barrier to you, wherever the enemies of my life may be visit them tonight with your Engel of destruction.

3. Power over time. By the pool of Bethesda, Jesus saw a man who had been disabled for 38 years. The Lord commanded him in John 5:8 to "'Stand up, pick up your mat, and walk!'".

It didn't matter that the man had been lame for almost four decades; when Jesus said "walk," he walked!

Sarah was 90 years plus before she got miracle of Isaac

Prayer: O Lord, God of possibilities, no matter the number of years of my impossibility, let tonight be my night of possibilities in the name of Jesus.

4. Power over quantity.

In John 6:1–15 Jesus fed a crowd of over 5,000 people with five small loaves and two pieces of fish. How could so little feed so many?

It was possible because lack of enough never limited Jesus' ability.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, because not enough never limit your ability, even with the work of my hands make all good things of life possible for me.

5. Power over nature. When a strong wind stirred up the sea and the terrified disciples strained at the oars to make it to shore, Jesus walked on the water and calmed the storm (6:16–21).

6. Power over misfortune.

In John 9:1–7 In Jerusalem, Jesus noticed a man blind since birth. Without hype or hoopla, the Light of the World brought light to the man's eyes.

7. Power over death.

In John 11:1–44 When Lazarus died for four days. His sisters had lost hope however, Jesus transformed their impossibility into the perfect opportunity to glorify God by bringing Lazarus back to life.
