Text: Psalm 42:11

"Why are you cast down, O my soul? And why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God; For I shall yet praise Him, The help of my countenance and my God." NKJV.

In these uncertain and discouraging times as waves of bad news continue to bombard us from the insecurity crisis to economic concerns, how is it possible not to lose heart? As human, none of us has a knows what can happen to this nation between now and next year. Even Jesus' closest companions dealt with discouragement and were tempted to lose hope.

Jesus knows when our hearts are faint.

There's no need to deny it when we feel hopeless. God hears our honest cry, "Lord, I feel like I'm losing heart. I need you God." Maybe you've been praying that for over the past few weeks."

Let us look at three ways from God's Word that you and your family can find hope when we are losing heart.

First, Pray and Never Give Up!

In Luke 18, Jesus tells a parable that illustrated a powerful principle of persistence in prayer.

In verse one the Bible says, "One day Jesus told His disciples a story to show that they should always pray and never give up."

It was the story of a persistent widow who appealed to an indifferent and unjust judge for justice. He would continue to ignore her, but she never gave up.

Luke 18:3 Now there was a widow in that city; and she came to him, saying, 'Get justice for me from my adversary.'

Luke 18:4 And he would not for a while; but afterward he said within himself, 'Though

I do not fear God nor regard man,
Luke 18:5 yet because this widow troubles me I will avenge her, lest by her continual
coming she weary me."

Luke 18:6 Then the Lord said, "Hear what the unjust judge said.

Luke 18:7 And shall God not avenge His own elect who cry out day and night to Him, though He bears long with them?

Luke 18:8 I tell you that He will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will He really find faith on the earth?"."

The implication in this story is clear.

If we don't pray, we will soon lose heart and give up.

God is not an unjust or indifferent judge.

He hears our cry. He understands. He cares. Prayer aligns our heart with His heart and gives us perseverance and hope.

Second, Invite Jesus Into Your Darkest Night

Satan will always tempt us to lose heart when we're in the dark and can't see where we are going. When we don't know what to do.

This is when the promises of God's Word strengthen us the most. But we must learn to rely on Him and His Word or we will lose heart.
